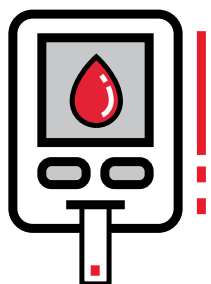
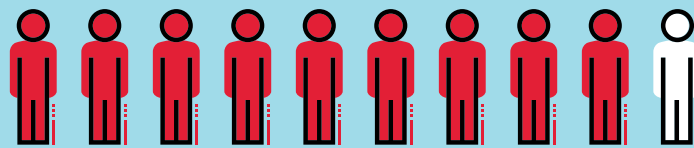


The rising costs of diabetes in America

That's nearly **1 in 10** people



84 million additional Americans have prediabetes†

That is approximately **1 in 4** people

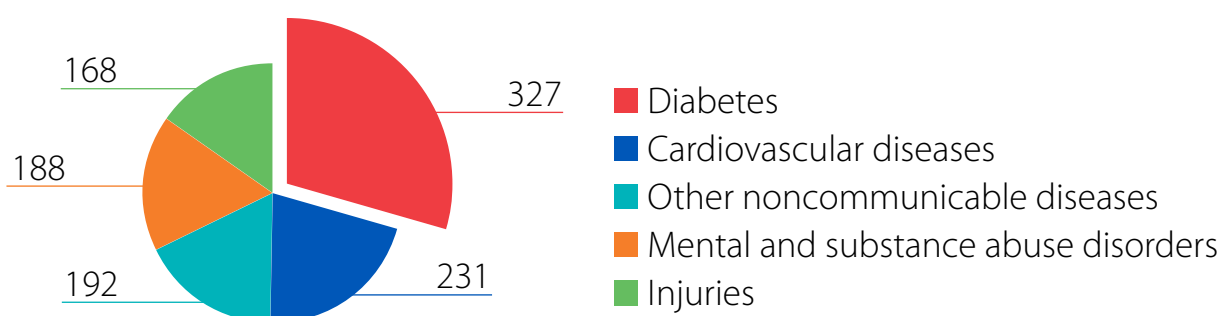
As the number of people with diabetes rises each year, so do the costs



As of 2017, diabetes cost the U.S. **\$327 billion** per year

This is almost **\$100 billion more** than the second highest healthcare cost, cardiovascular disease

Healthcare costs (billions)‡



In fact, **1 of every 4 healthcare dollars** spent in 2017 was for the care of people with diabetes§



Indirect costs are also substantial, with diabetes leading to **\$90 billion** in reduced productivity and more than **300 million work days lost** to the economy||,¶
